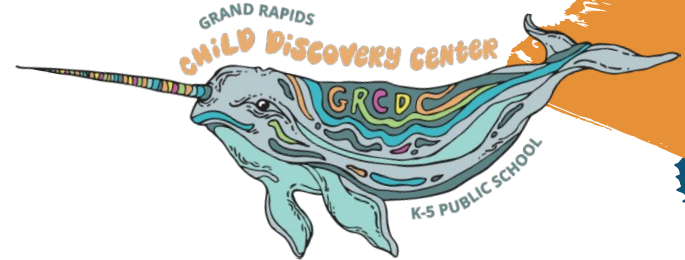

# GRCDC Goals 2022-24

<b>READING</b>	<b>By June 2024, as measured by the iReady Reading Diagnostic:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• At least 80% of all students will be at Mid or Above Grade Level</li><li>• At least 75% of all students will reach their Annual Typical Growth Goals</li><li>• At least 60% of all students will reach their Annual Stretch Growth Goals</li></ul>
<b>MATH</b>	<b>By June 2024, as measured by the iReady Math Diagnostic:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• At least 65% of all students to be at Mid or Above Grade Level</li><li>• At least 60% of all students to reach their Annual Typical Growth Goals</li><li>• At least 40% of all students to reach their Annual Stretch Growth Goals</li></ul>
<b>SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING</b>	<b>By June 2024, the GRCDC will create a culturally responsive, three tiered system of support that identifies no more than 5% of students qualifying for Tier III Social Emotional Learning support. [And 7% by June 2023]</b>

# Social Emotional Learning in 3 Tiers

**Tier 1**= Universal Supports- they are for everyone. Morning meeting, Closing Circle, Universal quiet signal, the 3 Bs, Conscious Discipline structures (school family, we care center, classroom jobs), positive adult language, interactive modeling, Empowering Education SEL curriculum

**Tier 2**= Small group or classroom based one on one supports around a specific CASEL competency (self awareness, self management, social awareness, relationship skills, responsible decision making). May include a low level informal behavior plan, check list, para support, or lunch bunch, proactive parent communication

**Tier 3**= Intensive, focused support with an interventionist, also based on a CASEL competency. Practice sessions and lessons with skill application back in the classroom. Can also include a more formal behavior plan, personal ladder of consequences, and/or a safety plan, parent problem solving conference

# Social Emotional Learning in 3 Tiers

The data we use is:

- SRSS-IE (Student Risk Scale Survey- Internalizing and Externalizing)
- Sometics Peer Relationship Survey
- Adult Relationship Mapping
- SWIS (major referrals)

Tier 1 should serve the needs of 80-85% of students

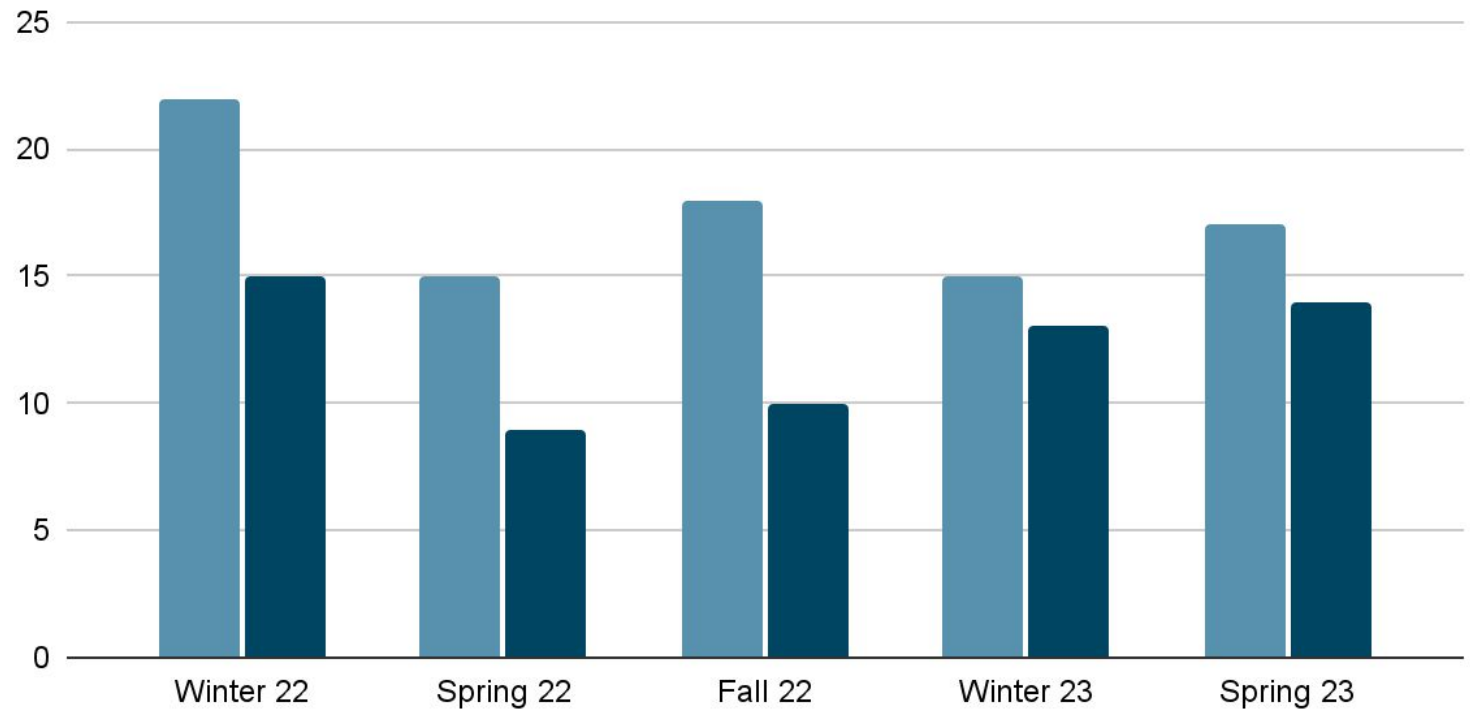
Tier 2 should serve the needs of 10-15% of students

Tier 3 should serve the needs of 5% of students

Tier 2 Tier 3



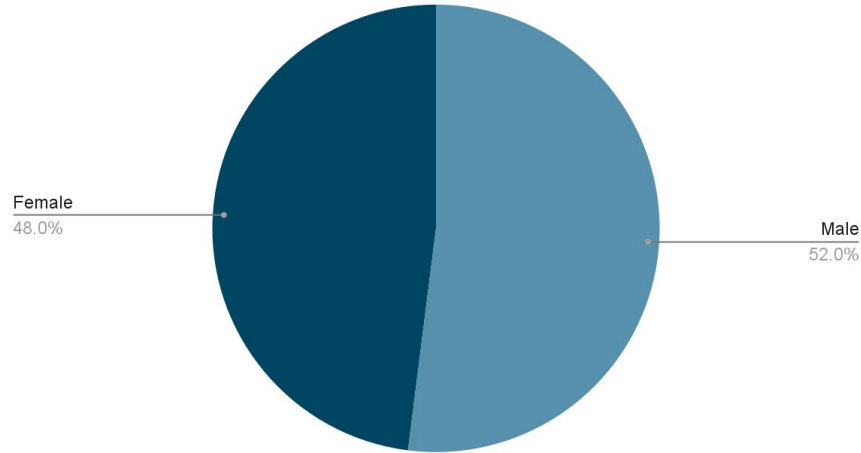

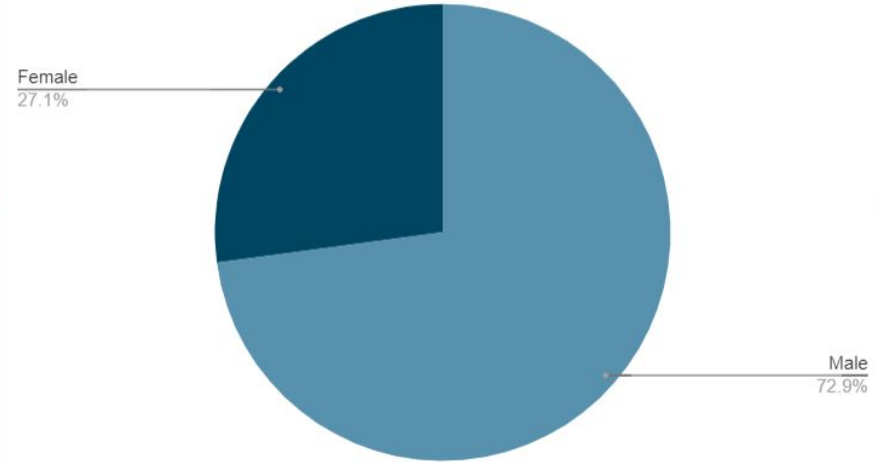

Total School Population Gender

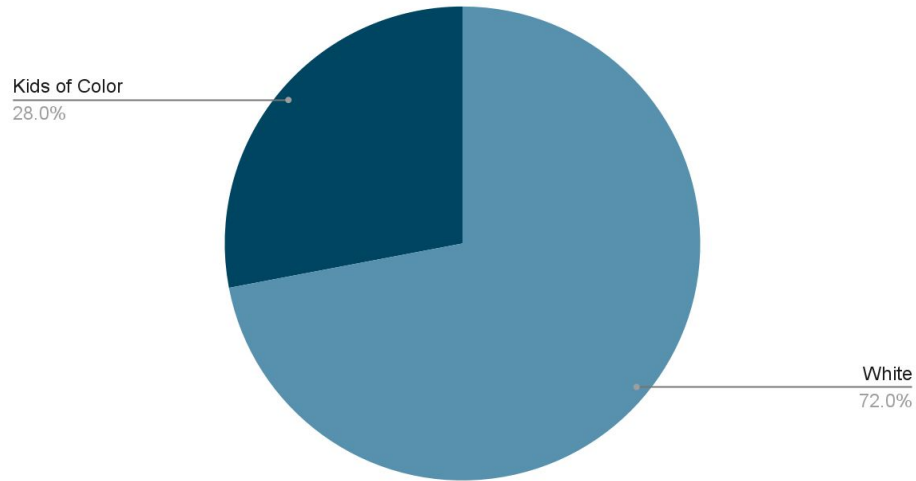


Gender Percentage in Tier III SEL

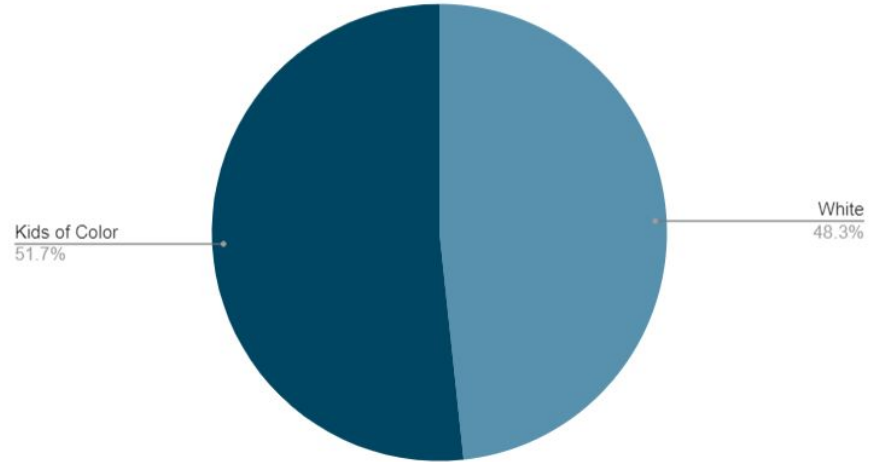

Total School Population Race

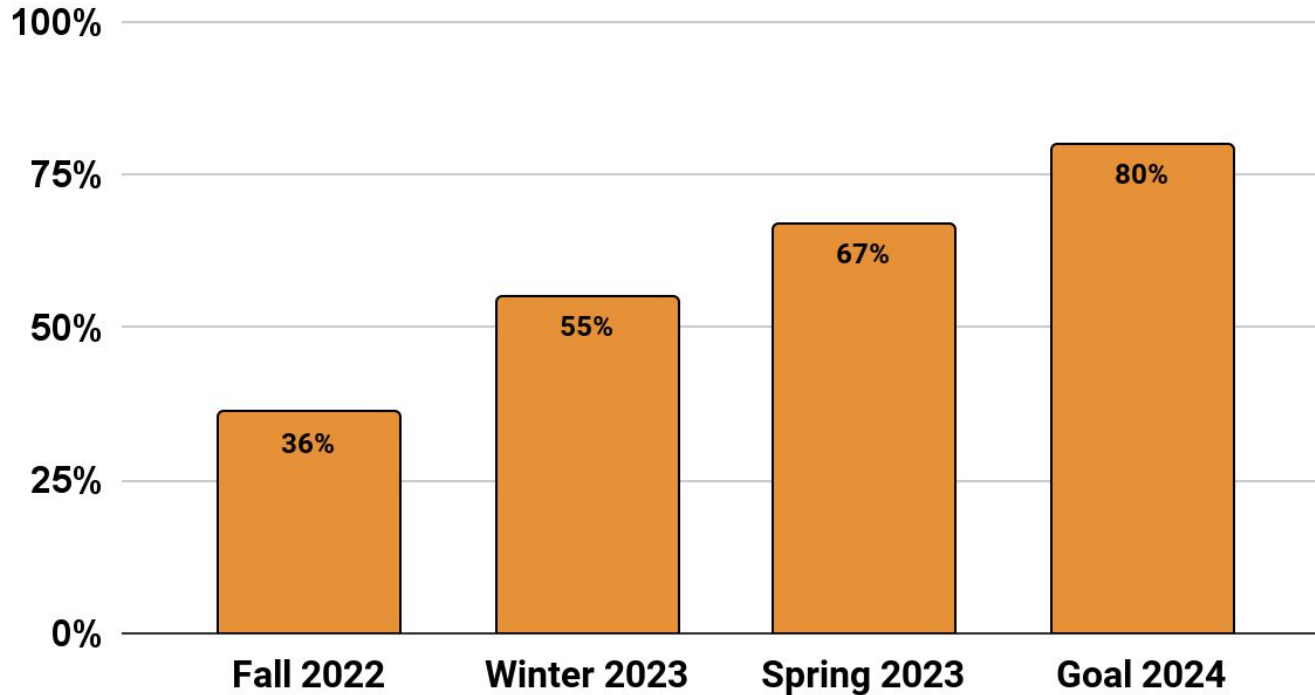


Race Percentage in Tier III SEL

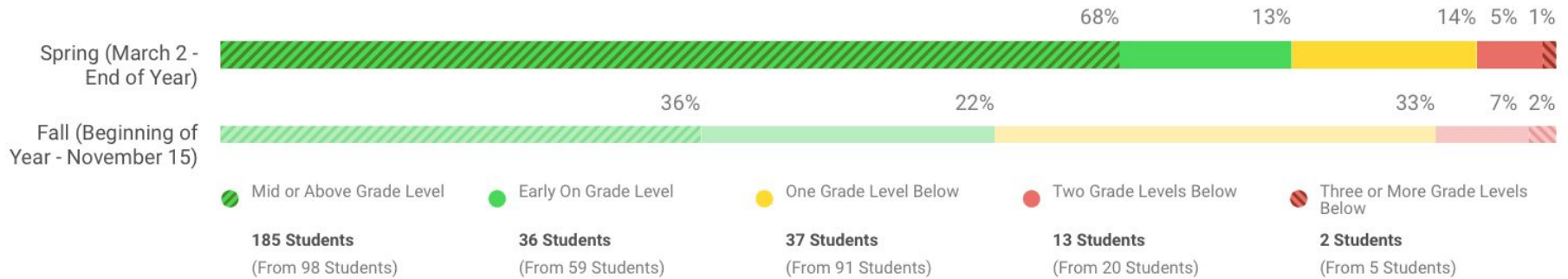

**% of Students at Mid Grade Level or Above**

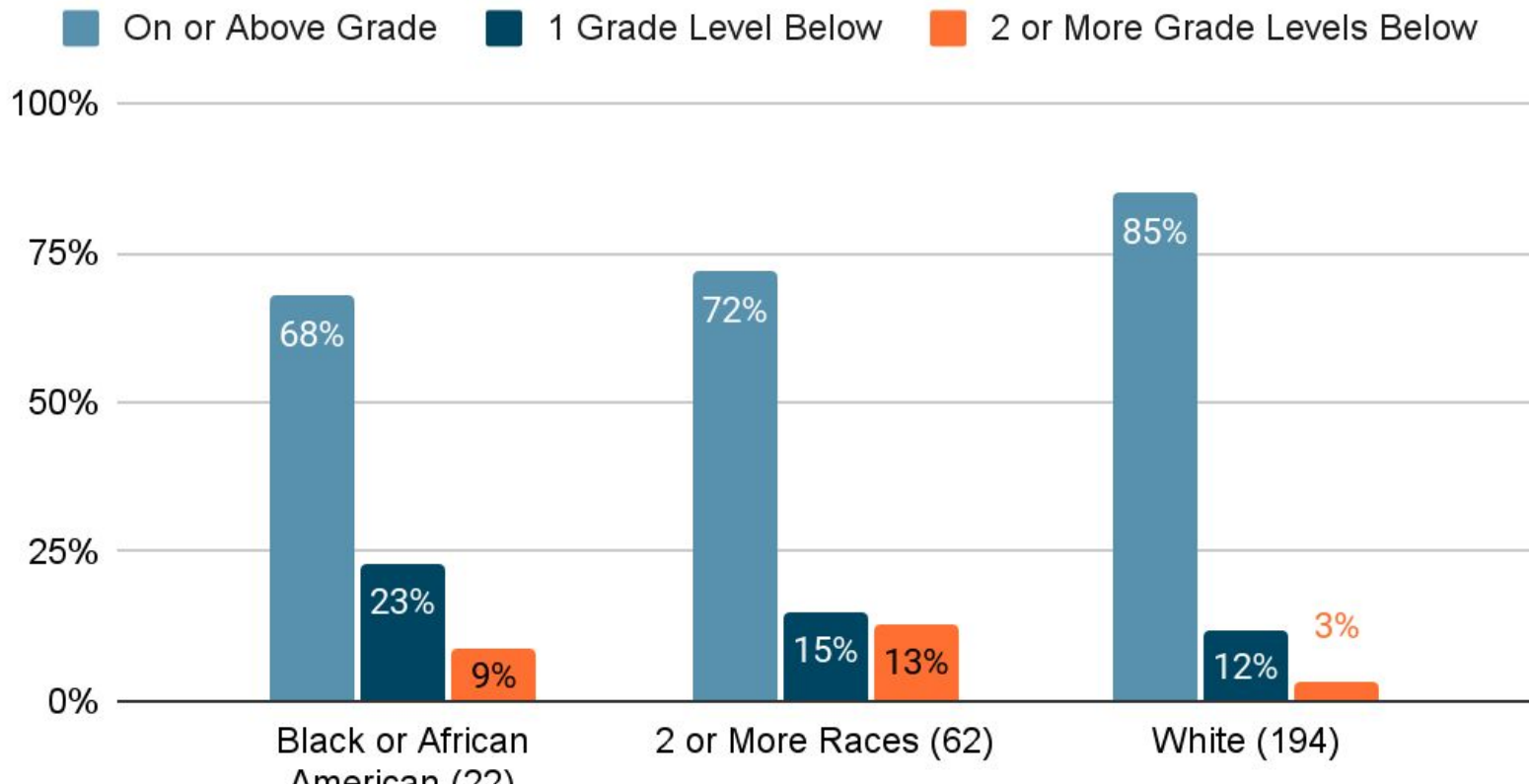





# iReady Reading Diagnostic: Spring 2023

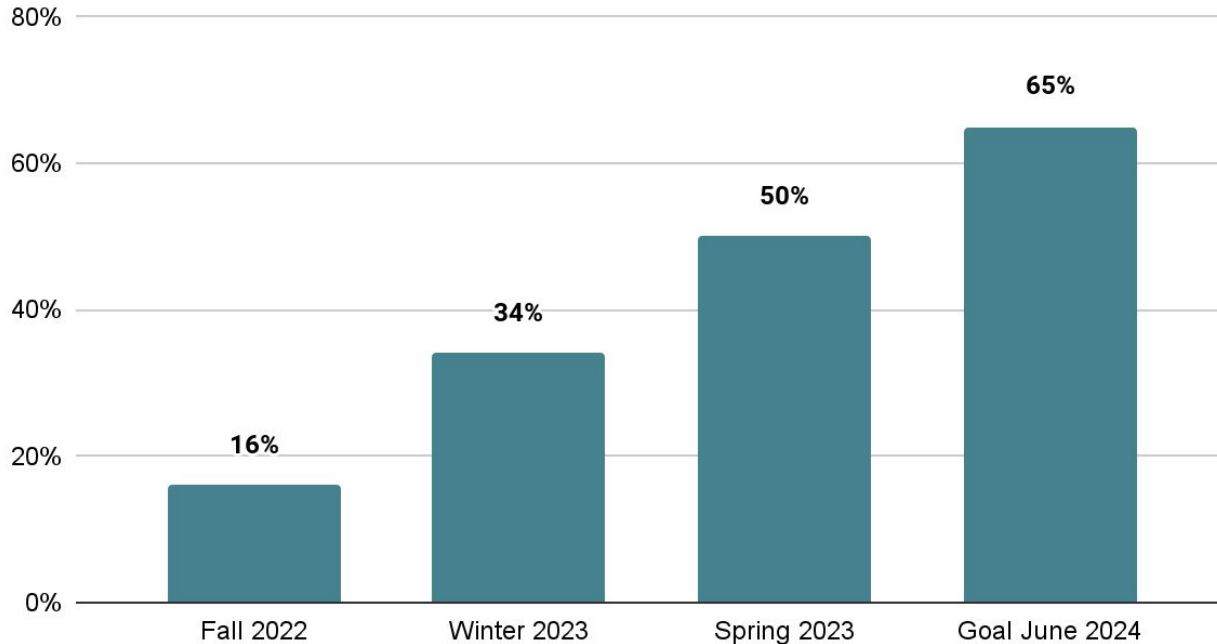
## Progress to Annual Typical Growth

Mid or Above Grade Level	 129%	60%	57%
Early On Grade Level	 134%	64%	78%
One Grade Level Below	 118%	63%	68%
Two Grade Levels Below	 136%	62%	62%
Three or More Grade Levels Below	 93%	40%	80%



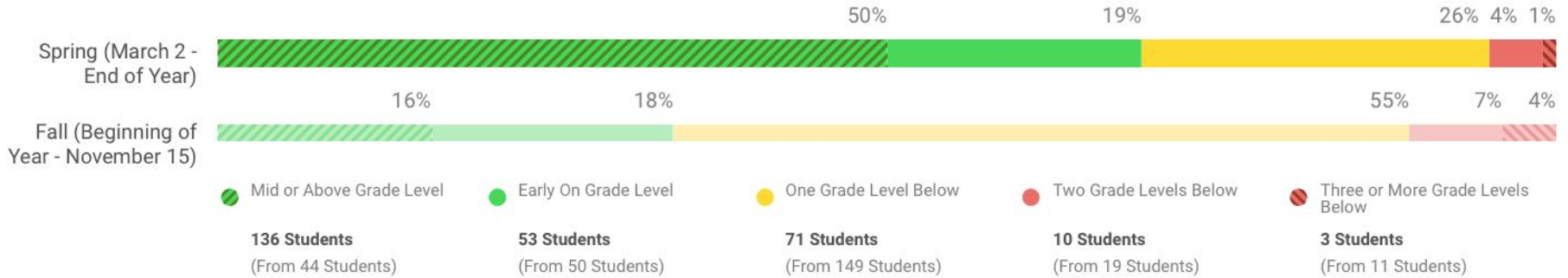

## % of Students at Mid Grade Level and Above



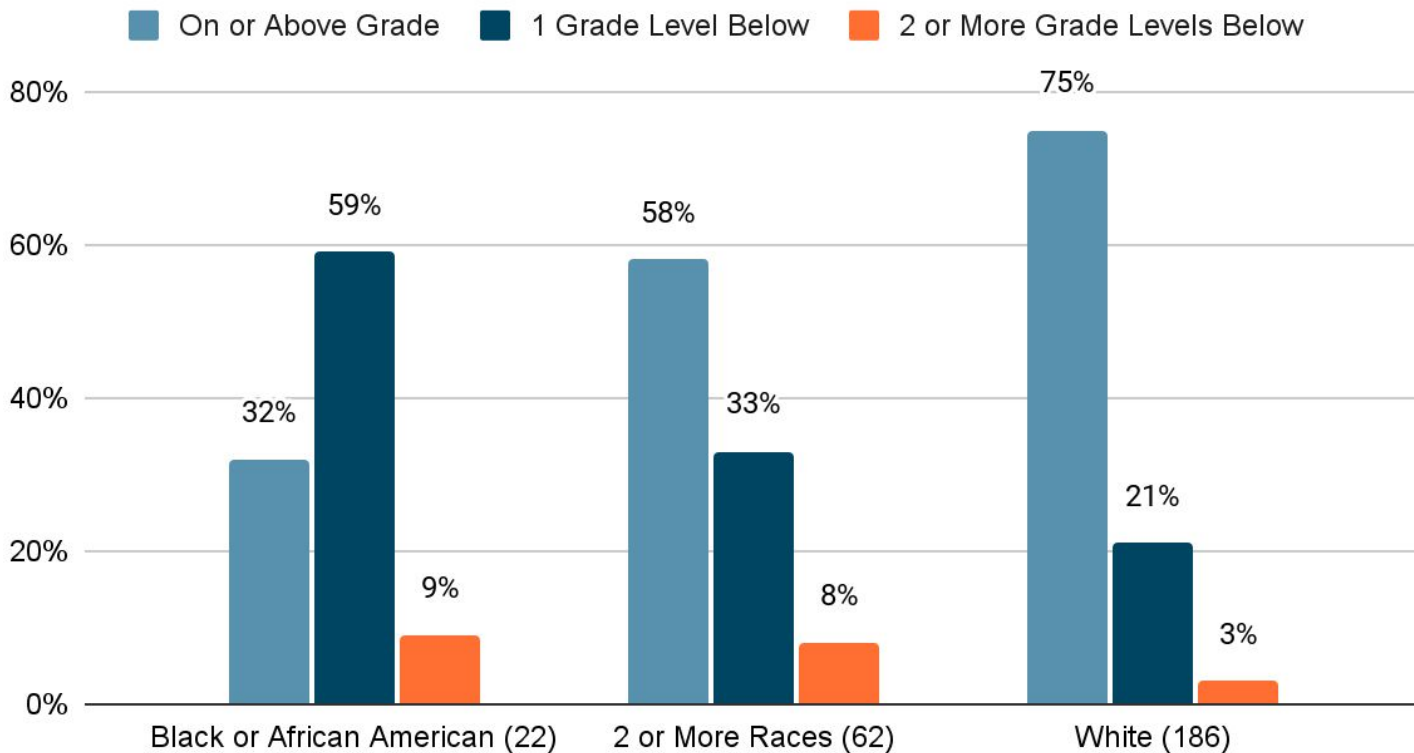




# iReady Math Diagnostic: Spring 2023
